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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Year Ended 30th June 2020.

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you to our 2020 Virtual AGM, my first as your new President.

I take the opportunity to thank our Immediate Past President Dr Kourosh Kayvani for his 15-year leadership, during which time the Association was revived from almost-extinction in 2004 to a small but respected boutique cross-discipline group dealing with iconic and innovative structures. The immense contribution of Brian O'Flaherty, a founding member, Past President and Life Member, who served as Treasurer for many years, is greatly appreciated. Brian left the Association in a sound financial position. Bob Cahill has stepped into Brian's shoes as our new Treasurer.

The year started with great enthusiasm as we pushed forward with our plans for the 2020 Conference and Design Awards, using yesterday's wisdom to inform tomorrow's vision, under the theme of *Re-View, Re-Imagine, Re-Create.* Together with the LSAA team (Rowan Murray, Bob Cahill and Peter Kneen) and Prof Jane Burry and Dr Greg Quinn of Swinburne University, we made preparations for the event to take place at Swinburne in September 2020. As we geared up and finalized details (with a film launch in Melbourne Design Week in March), the Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic resulted in the cancellation of the Melbourne Formula 1 event as well as most Design Week initiatives. In April, we took the difficult decision to postpone the event to October 2021.

Prior to the impact of COVID-19, the changes in regulations and testing requirements to meet new criteria for Fire Performance and their impact on the membrane/fabric structures became a hot topic for many members. The LSAA formed a Fire Subcommittee (FSC) lead by Mike Lester with Lisa James. The FSC met on several occasions and engaged the services of a prominent Fire Engineer, Jonathan Barnett, to produce a draft report and "road map" to assist the industry. Whilst COVID-19 has disrupted this work, we will be releasing these findings in the coming months.

On the digital front, our Facebook presence has been updated regularly by Scott Rathie. A new website was created for the LSAA 2020 Conference and our Executive Officer, Peter Kneen, has been devoting considerable time and effort towards revamping the LSAA website. The work to date has resulted in a new graphics interface.

Our rich archives of past proceedings and technical papers are also being curated. We look forward to providing a *members-only* access portal to these tomes of wisdom in the coming months.

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Presidents Report (cont.)

I am pleased to say that, despite having endured two non-conference years in a row (coupled with the COVID-19 pandemic), the LSAA remains in a reasonable financial position. This would not have been possible without the committed and continued support of members through the yearly fee subscription. Please accept my most sincere thanks for your support and membership.

Finally, I would like to thank all the volunteer committee members for their time and support. Without their selfless dedication of time and effort to our cause, none of what we do here would be possible.

Despite all the ways the challenges of this unprecedented year have buffeted both us at the LSAA and all of our members, I nonetheless remain proud of all we have undertaken amidst the throes of 2020, refusing to let disease and disaster define us – but instead forging new opportunities for the future. I look forward to continuing this magnificent work into next year and to welcoming each and every one of you (in person!) to the LSAA's exciting events of 2021.
